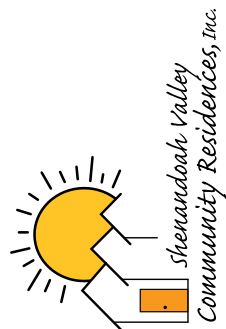

Shenandoah Valley Community Residences, Inc. (SVCR) was founded in 1980 as a private, not-for-profit 501(c)(3) charitable organization dedicated to providing residential services to adult men and women with intellectual disabilities.

Our goal is to help each resident achieve the greatest degree of independence while enjoying the best possible quality of life.

All of our programs are designed to help residents socialize more effectively, communicate better, solve the problems of everyday life, and manage their behavior.

What truly sets us apart? The energy and passion of our caring, dedicated staff.

Real Homes. Real Lives.

We teach our residents to live comfortably and safely in their SVCR homes, with instruction in:

- Personal hygiene
- Menu and dietary planning
- Food purchase and preparation
- Money management

Residents enjoy shopping, hiking, picnics, bowling, eating out, and going to the movies.

Expanding Life Experiences.

We also schedule opportunities to go fishing, attend concerts, take fall foliage train rides, and participate in Special Olympics practices and games.

On our vacations, we have visited recreational sites throughout Virginia and neighboring states. We have even camped in tents in the Shenandoah National Park.

Maximizing Independence.

- Group Home Program – Offering 24/7 supervision, including awake overnight staff.
- Supervised Apartment Program – Providing 10 – 15 hours a week of support for individuals who have demonstrated the capability of being left unsupervised.

In the above programs, residents must have day program arrangements, such as school, work, or a training program.

- Supported Living Program – For those who live in their own homes or apartments in the Winchester area and wish to benefit from educational and training opportunities.
- Associated Support Services – Arranging transportation to and from appointments and activities, providing recreational and leisure activities, and advocating for increased support at local, state, and national levels.
